

Celebrant: Most Rev Malcolm McMahon OP Archbishop of Liverpool

Gathering song: Laudate Omnes Gentes, Laudate Dominum Sing praises all you peoples; sing praises to the Lord (Taizé)

Greeting and blessing of the coffin with holy water at the church door

Please stand

Entrance Hymn: Be thou my vision

After each prayer offering the bread and wine all respond: **Blessed be God forever.**

Please stand

Priest: Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

Eucharistic Prayer

Priest: The Lord be with you.*All*: And with your spirit.

P: Lift up your hearts.

A: We lift them up to the Lord.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

A: It is right and just.

The priest reads the Preface, after which all join in saying: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel or sit

Acclamation after the Consecration:

Priest: The mystery of faith:

All: We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your resurrection, until you come again.

At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer:

Priest: Through him and with him, and in him, O God almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

All: Amen

Please stand

- **P:** At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:
- A: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
- *P*: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
- A: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever.
- P: Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you. Look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will, who live and reign for ever and ever.
- A: Amen.
- *P*: The peace of the Lord be with you always.
- A: And with your spirit.
- **P:** Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

Greet one another saying: 'Peace be with you'. Then we all say:

- Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us.

- **Priest:** Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.
- All: Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

If you do not usually receive Communion but would like to receive a blessing, join the queue and indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest.
